## The Future Ministry

In our January prayer letter, we shared with you about plans to move to Mascota to start a church and reach the surrounding towns. We had mentioned that there was another church there of another denomination. The church preaches the gospel of Jesus, is evangelistic, and is reaching into the surrounding towns. We recently spoke with another Baptist missionary who went there twenty years ago. He had led several people to the Lord and had reached into all the surrounding towns, the same ones we were praying for, distributing John and Romans. Most likely, the church in Mascota was formed with the people this missionary had won to the Lord. We believe God has closed the door for us to move there. The call that God put on us personally as missionaries to Mexico is to go where they don't have the gospel, and for that reason, we know God has closed the door on Mascota for us.

Would you please pray for us to know God's will for where He has us next? We are asking other missionaries and pastors here in Mexico and in other parts of the world about the unreached. We are waiting on God and prayerfully seeking where He is leading us, to the unreached or to another ministry.


Five Year Anniversary of the church in Estancia
